Dear Judge Polito:

Have you, as a judge, complied with Illinois law?

As a judge, you know or should know, Illinois law. In **Skolnick v. Altheimer & Gray**, 191 Ill. 2d 214, 229, 730 N.E.2d 4 (2000), our Supreme Court stated that "A trial court has a duty "to report attorney misconduct to the ARDC"; **Richardson v. Haddon**, 375 Ill. App. 3d 312, 873 N.E.2d 570 (2007).

Whenever a judge has a **duty**, he/she has no discretion. **Osborn v. Bank of the United States**, 9 Wheat (22 U.S.) 738, 866, 6 L.Ed 204 (1824).

On December 22, 2008 [Exhibit A], you were mailed a copy of my "Motion to Reconsider Motions in Meyer v. Meyer, case no. 99-D-283 (Will County) [Exhibit B]. As cited therein, the Illinois Supreme Court has repeatedly held that an Illinois judge, being an Illinois attorney, must comply with the Illinois Rules of Professional Conduct, and therefore has a mandatory, absolute, and individual **duty** to report the alleged, suspected, possible, and/or actual misconduct of another attorney or judge to the ARDC, under Illinois law.

As you have been informed, and therefore knew, that attorney Edward R. Jaquays engaged in fraud, deception and/or misrepresentation to the Court by his filing a Petition in violation of 750 ILCS 5/2-508. Further, that Judge Robert Baron had no statutory authority to hear and grant any relief to attorney Edward R. Jaquays and/or the Law Firm of Edward R. Jaquays.

I presume that you have fully and completely complied with Illinois law and have reported the above mentioned attorneys to the ARDC.

In the possible event that you have not fully and completely complied with Illinois law, then you have knowingly, intentionally, deliberately, capriciously, arbitrarily, and/or intentionally conspired with, colluded with, and/or participated with, the above attorneys and/or judge to engage in acts in violation of the Rule of Professional Conduct, in an act of violating Illinois law, and further have evidenced your bias against me, a due process violation in violation of the Supremacy Clause of the U.S. Constitution.

Please provide me and the Court with a copy of your ARDC complaint relative to the attorneys in the law firm of Edward Jaquays.
